Full time hairstylist program (1500 hours)

Our Beginners courses are for anyone with a dream to become a great hairdresser. An industry must for anyone wanting to learn the core techniques of hairdressing. Previous hairdressing experience is not required as we will teach you all the skills; however you must bring along a bit of vision, flair and bags of enthusiasm.

Course description:

This 9 month for full-time students (20 months for part-time students) 1500 hours program is designed for the beginner. This program focuses on the theoretical and practical knowledge and experience that the novice stylists require in order to transition themselves into a successful career within the hair industry, while being exposed to the European Academy Hairdressing culture. It is based on the synthesis of the best European Schools' traditions, knowledge and techniques and Canadian Experience

Course Outlines

This course is broken down into 2 parts. Classroom lectures and in-salon practical sessions are the focal point of learning. The student will be in the classroom learning the fundamentals of hair styling and dressing. Examples of topics to be covered are:

- Health and Sanitation (infection control)
- Use of Products, Tools, and Equipment (safety)
- Sciences (chemistry, anatomy, biology, bacteriology, physiology)
- Product Knowledge (use and safety)
- Principles and Techniques of Hair Styling
- Principles and Techniques of Hair Cutting
- Hair Coloring
- Permanent Waving
- Chemical Relaxing.
- Skin Chemical Procedures
- Principles and Techniques of Scalp and Hair Treatment
- Principles of Skin Care Treatments
- Application of Cosmetics
- Principles and Techniques of Nail Services
- Career and Employment Information (professional ethics, effective communication and human relations, compensation, licensing requirements and regulations, principles of business management)

The instructor guided working salon/field experience will be the focus of the first 6 months. Then students will graduate to the cutting floor where they will work on clients while being supervised by our cutting and colouring instructors for the rest of the course.

Apprenticeship: Available at European Academy Salon or Academy-friendly salons.

*Graduates from Ministry approved 1500 hour Hairstylist programs at private hairstyling schools are only required to complete 2,000 hours of on-the-job training. To get a position as an apprentice, you must apply directly to employers and find one to sponsor your apprenticeship. You can find employers by looking in the Yellow Pages (the telephone directory for businesses), local newspapers, or just by walking into hair salons in your neighborhood (this is called a cold call visit). Employers are looking for a well-written resume and your ability to sell yourself (tell them why you will be good for their beauty shop or salon). Once you have a job, employers will be looking for high quality work and reliability. You may need to demonstrate your skills as part of the interview process. When you find a position, you must register your apprenticeship training agreement with a Workplace Training Branch Apprenticeship office. Once you have completed the apprenticeship, you will receive a Certificate of Apprenticeship.
